



# St. Francis of Assisi Parish

August 16, 2009 • 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

## Good Morning, Good People!

The Eucharist is both meal and sacrifice. Jesus gives us the Eucharist at the Last Supper as he is celebrating the Passover meal with his disciples. The Last Supper is a “Memorial Meal,” a meal in which the participants recall a historical event and make it relevant in light of their present circumstances. (Thanksgiving is our memorial meal: we recall the feast at

Jamestown and we thank God for what we have received throughout the past year.) Jesus, along with the disciples, recalls the historical Passover event in Egypt, and then Jesus applies the meaning of Passover to his present circumstance; his impending death on the cross is a fulfillment of the Passover event.



Jesus sees the shedding of his blood as analogous to the blood of the Passover lamb shed many years before—as protection from death. Jesus therefore identifies himself with the unleavened bread and wine used at the Passover meal. Recall the words that have been transmitted to us through the Scriptures: “Take this all of you and eat: This is my body which will be given up for you,” and “Take this all of you and drink from it: This is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.”

In this weekend’s Gospel, we Jesus teaches the crowd that he is giving his flesh for the life of the world. It is reasonable for the crowd to ask how Jesus is going to do this. 21 centuries after the event, it is easy for us to understand that Jesus is speaking about the Eucharistic bread and cup. We believe it is Jesus’ body and blood. But is there a deeper meaning to “eating?”

For me, eating is a metaphor for chewing, swallowing, and digesting not only food, but also ideas. The crowd has to take in, “chew,” “swallow,” and “digest” belief in Jesus and who he is— as well as his message and the signs Jesus is performing. It must have taken some time for people fully to appreciate, understand and believe. Aren’t we

still getting further insights into Jesus all these years after the Resurrection?

What we believe about the Eucharist in 2009 has so much more meaning and nuance than what the early Christians perceived or understood. Yet they understood that the Eucharist is the communal meal that recalls the death and resurrection of Jesus, the meal and sacrifice that frees them from death, that recalls their liberation from slavery to sin, that sustains and nourishes them on their journey through life, just as the manna did.

Let us always Eucharist in memory of Jesus.

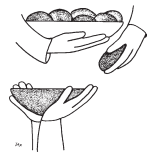
