5th Sunday in Lent

## Good Morning, Good People!

The Third Sunday of Lent found Jesus at the well with the Samaritan Woman. In Jewish thinking, she would have been a heretic, someone “a good Jew” would despise, since Samaritans not only contaminated Jewish Teaching, but also did not worship at the temple in Jerusalem. Jesus does not condemn her for her error; instead, Jesus simply states his own belief and the thinking behind that belief. Through this personal encounter with Jesus, the Samaritan woman comes to believe that Jesus is the Messiah.



Last week, we saw Jesus cure the blind man, a Jew, a believer. The initial question raised is “Who sinned, this man or his parents?” Jesus’ response is, “Neither this man nor his parents sinned.” The man’s blindness is an opportunity to do a work of God, so Jesus cures him. The misfortune of others provides us with opportunities to do a work of God, to have compassion on others.

This week, we hear the riveting story of the Raising of Lazarus. Jesus is no longer dealing with strangers here: “Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus.”

At the beginning of the story, Jesus tells the disciples that he is going to Judea to wake up Lazarus. Jesus believes that death is like slumber,

that one who is dead will wake again through resurrection. This was not a new idea. All Pharisees believed in the resurrection; this was one of the distinctions between the Pharisees and the Sadducees. Martha herself believed in the resurrection. What is significant is that Jesus identifies himself with the resurrection and life itself. *“I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and who ever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?”*

But wait a minute—believers of Jesus do die! St. Peter died; he believed in Jesus. Martha and Mary died, they believed in Jesus. St. Francis and St. Clare died; they too believed in Jesus. Many of our friends and relatives have died, and they believed in Jesus. What is going on here? Jesus must have a different concept of death. Could Jesus be talking about spiritual death? I think so; it is the only way the quotation makes sense.

Many of us who claim to be the friends of Jesus have ignored or lost that friendship one way or another. We believed in Jesus, but our relationship with him died for whatever reason. We can come back to life. Jesus can resurrect that relationship and make it live again. For those of us who have kept our relationship with Jesus alive, we can be reassured that it will never die. Jesus asks us today, *“Do you believe this?”*

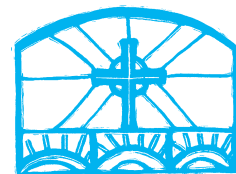

## HOLY WEEK AND TRIDUUM

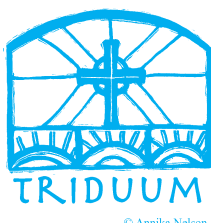


### PASSION/PALM SUNDAY PROCESSION

Before Mass on Passion (Palm) Sunday, we will gather in the park across from the church and process in together.

### THE PASCHAL TRIDUUM

The word Triduum (pronounced "TRIH-doo-uhm") comes from the Latin and means "three days." Triduum refers to the three most sacred days in the church year, beginning with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, reaching its high point at the Easter Vigil and concluding with evening prayer on Easter Sunday—one liturgy in three interlocking movements: we wash one another's feet (Holy Thursday), reverence the cross (Good Friday), light fires in the night, proclaim the stories of our salvation, and welcome new members into the church through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist (Easter Vigil). All are especially invited to come together as community to celebrate these sacred days.



### HOLY THURSDAY COLLECTION

At the beginning of Lent, the Adult Faith Formation Committee suggested that we donate money saved by not eating meat to Loaves & Fishes, and they provided special envelopes for our donations (available at the doors of the church). In addition, our Holy Thursday collection will go to feed the hungry at Loaves and Fishes.



### HOLY THURSDAY FOOTWASHING

As part of the Holy Thursday Liturgy of the Word, we remember that moment of the Last Supper when Jesus washed the feet of the apostles. In the quiet of the first evening of Triduum, after weeks of Lenten journeying, we bathe one another's feet in warm, scented water.

Stations will be placed throughout the church as we are once again invited to do as Jesus instructed: to be washed and to wash—acts of humility and charity. Those who would like to participate will remove their shoes and socks, and wait, seated, until invited by the ushers to move towards the nearest station. Participants will have their feet washed and will then turn to wash the feet of the next person.

This is a grace-filled experience, an opportunity to practice the gospel message—to be of service to one another, especially to those who are strangers to us.
