Freedom of speech and expression have been a tradition at St. Francis for many years. The right to uncensored peaceful expression in or on publicly owned spaces is undeniable.

Any individual or group that wishes to distribute printed material, or gather signatures for a political or issue oriented purpose must contact the St. Francis Parish Council. Specific requests can be send to the Parish Council c/o the Parish Center. The Council will review these requests at the meeting following the request. The Parish Council meets on the second Tuesday of the month in Brunsman Hall at 7:00pm. All parishioners are welcome!

Any individual or group wishing to be included in our announcements at the Masses, or wishing to address the congregation, must first seek approval directly from the Pastor.

The intent of this statement is to create a broad concept that will provide the foundation for evolving policy. There are many affiliate organizations with which the parish currently enjoys relationships. This statement does not necessarily affect any ongoing agreements.
